Nursing now Launched in Cambodia











UP Nursing and Midwifery was represented when nurses and midwives came together nationally last week to celebrate the launching of Nursing Now Campaign in Cambodia. Nursing Now is a growing global movement that will run to the end of 2020 – the 200th anniversary of Florence Nightingale's birth –to raise the profile of nurses worldwide.

HE Professor Thy Kruy outlined the development of nursing in Cambodia over the last decade and the significant impact this has had on healthcare and health outcomes. In her key note address, Professor Judith Shamian, ICN President Emerita, talked about the economic as well as social good sense it made for governments to invest in their nursing workforce. Countries around the world face huge challenges providing health care to their people because of scarce resources, the rising burden of chronic diseases like diabetes, and the impact of emerging factors such as climate change and migration. Nurses hold the key to success for everyone to achieve their right to health and health care –to achieve universal health care- and will be a key part of the solution to today's health challenges.

As part of the Nursing Now campaign, the Nightingale Challenge asks for every health employer to provide leadership and development training for a group of young nurses and midwives during 2020, to come together to develop the next generation of young nurses and midwives as leaders, practitioners and advocates in health.

### **UP DENTAL CLINIC STAFF ATTEND CAD/CAM**











Recently Dr Horn Sereybot (UP Dental Clinic Manager) and Dr Po Malen (UP Clinical Tutor) attended a 5 day continuing education course on Digital Dentistry at Yang Ming National University (YMNU) in Taiwan. Digital Dentistry is an exciting new international trend which dentists of the future will need to engage with. The focus of the course was on how crowns and bridges can be designed and constructed accurately and efficiently by using intra-oral scanners and a CAD/CAM technology (using a special robotic machine connected to a computer which mills the crowns from blocks of ceramic material). Crowns can be made in hours - compared with the traditional technique which takes days.

Dr Sereybot and Dr Malen will be able to pass on this new information to our senior dental students who will need to use this technology in the future. There were 20 participants from 10 different universities in South East Asia. The event was part of an ongoing collaboration between University of Puthisastra and Yang Ming National University. In the future more activities are planned between students and staff from both universities.

#### PRISON VISIT BY PRESIDENT IAN AND THE UP DENTAL TEAM



UP dental students visit one of the three main Phnom Penh Prisons one day every week year-round to provide basic dental services. UP President Professor Ian Findlay accompanied by Dean Dr. Callum Durward from the Faculty of Dentistry made a surprise visit last week to observe the project first hand. The UP team received a warm welcome from the Prison Director and our partners from One-2-One Cambodia. One-2-One has an MOU with the Department of Prisons to provide this service.

On arrival early in the morning, the students quickly set up 6 portable dental chairs, a generator, dental instruments and materials, fans and sterilizing equipment. Supervising dentist Dr Limheng soon had the chairs filled with patients, most of whom had toothache and required dental extractions. A few had teeth which could be saved and one of our senior female students set about filling teeth using one of three portable dental units.

The Prison Dental Service has been running for 10 years, and UP is proud to support such a worthwhile project, which not only brings urgently needed dental treatment to the approximately 10,000 prisoners in Phnom Penh's overcrowded prisons, but also provides an excellent opportunity for UP students to develop their skills in clinical dentistry. The project demonstrates in very practical terms one of UP's missions which is to "help others".

#### IMPLANT TRAINING FROM CHIANGMAI UNIVERSITY (CMU)







Two dental academics from Chiang Mai University (CMU) recently visited UP to demonstrate placement of a new brand of implant which they have helped to develop. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Pathawee Khongkhunthian, Director of Center of Excellence for Dental Implantology, Faculty of Dentistry, Chiang Mai University was accompanied by Dr. Sam Lyly, a Cambodian PhD candidate in implantology at CMU. UP has an MOU with CMU specifically to develop the area of implantology. Dr Lyly will come again in the near future to train our staff and students on the placement of mini-implants for patients who have no lower teeth. The implants make dentures much easier to wear, and the technique is safe and relatively simple. CMU has done a lot of research in this area. The implant treatment provided at UP is of a high standard and is overseen by Dr Tak Ranuch, specialist in periodontics. The University of Puthisastra is happy to support our senior dental students to learn and practice implantology.

#### **UP LAUNCHED RESEARCH JOURNAL CLUB**

In collaboration with the all the Faculties and the Department of Research, a weekly Journal Club & Research Presentations has just started. It was great to have Dr Sarath from Medicine present his research on 'Medical Professionalism'. His presentation generated lots of questions from staff and students in the audience.

The Journal Club & Research Presentations is a chance for staff and students to share their research or journal article critique with other people in a supportive and encouraging environment. It is a great chance to find out what staff and students are doing in other Faculties and talk about research. It is also a good opportunity to practice skills in presenting and answering questions from an audience especially if staff/students are presenting at a conference.

## UP DENTAL STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN THE CAMBODIAN HEALTH AND NUTRITION MONITORING STUDY

For the past two years UP dental students, under the direction of Dr Bethy Turton (UP Fellow) and Dr Chher Tepirou (Chief Dental Officer for Cambodia at MOH) have participated in the important longitudinal Cambodian Health and Nutrition Monitoring Study ("My Health") involving about 4,000 mothers and their preschool children. The study is in part supported by UNICEF. Twelve year 6 and 7 UP dental students joined other team members from IU and the MOH (lead by Dr Hou Sokuntheary) for 9 days in Kratie to collect the data. The study, which has an oral health component, is also being conducted in Phnom Penh and Ratanakiri. In Kratie, 1959 children were examined and 1142 mothers were interviewed, to record dietary, growth and development, and oral health information, as well as assessment of how oral health has affected their lives using the Oral-Health-Related Quality-of-Life index. Fluoride varnish was applied to the teeth of 1609 children.

Initial findings showed a high level of tooth decay starting before 2 years of age, a high sugar diet, and a lack of oral hygiene among many young children. Risk factors to dental caries have been identified. Links between poor oral health and other developmental and general health problems are being explored. One paper with data from the study has already been published, and more publications are underway. The findings of the study will inform the future development of public health interventions which could lead to improvements in child oral health in Cambodia.
