UP HOSTS IMPORTANT WORKSHOP ON CROSS INFECTION CONTROL DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC











Recently, in collaboration with the MOH and Cambodian Dental Council, UP hosted an important continuing professional development (CPD) seminar entitled "GUIDELINES FOR CROSS-INFECTION CONTROL IN CAMBODIAN DENTAL CLINICS DURING AND AFTER THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC ". The workshop was held online using ZOOM from the UP Kospo Room on Sunday 20 December. Over 500 dentists registered to join the meeting, which was sponsored by UP and the GOFEN company.

Professor Ian Findlay, UP's President welcomed the participants, and this was followed by introductory comments from HE Dr Oeun Boraroth, Secretary of State from MOH, and HE Dr Sokhom Rithivuth, President of the Dental Council. The two keynote speakers were Professor Hong Someth, Vice President of the Cambodian Dental Council, and Ms Glenda Stainton, a very experienced dental therapist from NZ who has been living and working in Cambodia for the past 4 years.

The sessions were chaired by Dr Chher Tepirou, Chief Dental Officer from the MOH, and Assistant Prof Soeun Sopharith from UP. Following the excellent presentations there was a time for questions and discussion. All participants received 3 CPD points from the Dental Council and a certificate of attendance. The session will be repeated on 7 January for up to 500 dental students from UP, UHS, IU and the Institute of Health Science of the Royal Cambodian Armed Forces.

UP's held an online Pharmacy Clubs Opening Ceremony at 12:30 to 2:00pm on 25th December. These clubs include Pharma-Career, Senior Pharmacy Club and Clinical Pharmacy Club and are created to support pharmacy students' studies and to ensure the quality of pharmacy education.

Pharma-Career Club is a club for pharmacy students from Foundation year to Year 5 and it is held every Thursday from 1:00 to 2:00 pm. The aim of Pharma-Career Club is to orient pharmacy students to choose the right career pathway based on their competencies and potentials, to provide students with successful experiences from professionals in field of pharmacy, and to train pharmacy students with skills needed to be successful future careers.

For the Senior Club – its times are every Friday from 1:00 to 2:00 pm and its purpose is to support fourth and fifth year pharmaceutical students on exam tips and successful keys for upcoming graduation exam and national exit exam.

DR. HORN SEREYBOT AWARDED POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN CLINICAL ORTHODONTICS FROM UK

Recently Dr. Horn Sereybot, our UP Dental Clinic Manager, was awarded a Post-graduate Diploma in Clinical Orthodontics from the UK. This 2-year program was organized through the Orthosociety organization in collaboration with City of London Dental School and University of Bolton. Dentists from many countries attended including those from Singapore, Malaysia, Taiwan, Indonesia, Hong Kong, and Thailand, but Dr Sereybot was the only participant from Cambodia.

Each candidate was required to complete an orthodontic theory course and practical components. During the course there was a comprehensive entry examination, submission of 10 completed cases, a final matriculation exam and an oral case presentation conducted by City of London Dental School. Assistant Professor Anand Marya, our Head of Discipline for Orthodontics at UP, was the local mentor for the program and supervised Dr Sereybot's orthodontic cases. Dr. Sereybot intends to share his knowledge and experience with UP undergraduate students, as well as providing treatment for private orthodontic patients in the UP Dental Clinic. Congratulations to Dr Sereybot who is now part of our growing orthodontic team.





UP DENTAL CLINIC OPEN FOR BUSINESS





On Monday 4 January UP dental students will be back in force in the UP dental clinic. Although the clinic has continued to run from Monday to Saturday during the recent Covid scare, numbers of patients were down. However, our clinic staff, orthodontists and residents did a great job providing treatment to those who needed it during this period, closely adhering to the National Cross Infection Control Guidelines.

Now that students are back, we expect the numbers of patients to pick up, and services will get back to normal again. We are presently open for patients needing all types of dental care, including implants, dentures and orthodontics. Patients can choose whether to be treated by a dental student, a general dentist or a specialist. Recently we have erected two new signs to advertise the clinic which share our exceptionally low prices for quality treatment. The clinic is open Monday to Saturday from 8.30am until 5pm, and Monday, Wednesday and Friday evenings from 5 to 7pm.

NURSING STUDENTS GET READY FOR GRADUATION EXAM

Nursing students will soon be taking their upcoming Internal Exit Exam as well as National Exit Exam. Nursing Department conducted Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) training for nursing students of BSN-Batch4 and ADN-Batch7 to help prepare and strengthen students' abilities by reviewing the exam-checklists and reviewing practical classes. Their OSCE training consists of 23 procedures BSN and 20 procedures for ADN. The OSCE internal exit exam was originary scheduled for 23rd-24th December but had to be rescheduled because of COVID-19.

UP's Faculty of Pharmacy has also prepared OSCE Mock Test for year-5 pharmacy students who will take the exit examination in the upcoming month. This mock test was prepared by using computer-based systems for Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE). The mock test exam was similarly designed to simulate the real exam in the purpose of identifying student's strengths and weaknesses, and finding ways to improve students' capacity to succeed in either graduation exam or national exit exam. Apart from this, it also builds students' confidence, readiness, and spirit to overcome the challenges on the way.

Pharmacist are one of the many health practitioners who need to interact professionally with patients. Mock test will provide students with more opportunities to improve their professionalism. The mock test is an ideal way to prepare students for graduate life – as it allows students to make mistakes in school rather than in the community.

UP does a huge amount of work to improve quality of education in health sciences and information technology to reach international level and is strongly committed to produce highest quality graduates with knowledge, skills and good attitudes to serve the Cambodian community. For instance, in December 16-18, 2020, Senior Club, which is coordinated by Mr Eang Pharnith, Pharmacy Lab Assistant and Mr NY Chanseiha, Full time Lecturer, Faculty of Pharmacy, prepared the OSCE Mocks test online for the batch 5 students who will attends exit examination.

This mock test is also a key of success for our Pharmacy faculty. As the result, UP pharmacy maintains its outstanding record as Highest Exam Passing Rate in the whole country.

BIOGRAPHY: MRS. SIM SOEURN, ROTATION OFFICER IN THE FACULTY OF MEDICINE



Born in Takeo Province into a family of farmers, Mrs. Sim Soeurn has six siblings. She was educated at Life University in Preah Sihanouk Province since 2009, and during her bachelor degree studies she was also at Chung-Ang University in South Korea for a period of one year. She got her Bachelor Degree of Science in Nursing in 2014. While studying at Life University, Mrs. Soeurn took part in a research study on Patients' satisfaction with Health Providers in Cambodia. After graduation, she became an assistant lecturer in the Nursing and Midwifery College of her former University.

From 2016 to mid-2019 Mrs. Soeurn worked as Nurse Counselor with Doctors Without Borders to the "Hepatitis C Project", screening people living with HIV for hepatitis C and providing education on infection prevention.

In September 2019, Mrs. Soeurn joined UP as Rotation Officer in the Faculty of Medicine. She says she is very happy to be part of an excellent team, to work with medical students and to assist them in their clerkships and internships.

LAB MANAGEMENT AT UP IN 2020

In health there are three main types of learning:

- 1. Theory usually taught in lectures
- 2. Lab practice learning practical skills in laboratories, often simulated practice
- 3. Experiential learning learning in a clinical context, in real life situations

Labs are therefore an integral part of the learning experience at UP. All health-related programs rely very heavily on practice skills that are first exercised in the labs after which experience is build up further in clerkships and internships.

With the shutdown of all educational institutes across Cambodia, on Monday 16th March due to the Covid-19 pandemic, theoretical classes continued online but practical classes unfortunately had to come to a halt. In order to be able to get the students back in the labs as soon as possible labs had to be prepared to adhere to new Covid-19 related regulations as set by the ministries of Health and Education, Youth & Sports.

Mr. Hem Chanvatanak is UP's full-time laboratory manager, who co-ordinates and oversees all laboratory activities at UP. Under his organization labs were stocked with essential personal protection equipment (PPE), adorned with signage for safety measures, and provided with the Safety Guidelines for Reopening of Laboratories at UP in both English and Khmer. A major task was reorganizing the seating of the

labs to adhere to social distancing rules which was a coordinated effort between Mr. Chanvatanak, the lab assistants and other staff from all faculties and admin staff.

All these efforts in conjunction with UP's communication with MoH resulted in labs being reopened on Monday 7th September, which was followed, after inspection by MoEYS, by reopening of the whole university on Monday 21st September.

It has been challenging for all faculties to catch up on the practical part of their courses, due to the limited number of students and staff allowed in the labs at each session but coordinated scheduling has made up for quite a bit of lost time, although it has since been interrupted by two more shutdowns.

As the campus will reopen for classes on the 4th of January Mr. Chanvatanak's job will continue to provide assistance in scheduling of ongoing and upcoming classes and help out the faculties in their lab activities where needed.



UP DENTAL STUDENTS LEARN FROM OVERSEAS EXPERTS



Dental students need to learn about how to manage patients with complex medical conditions, as well as geriatric patients and patients with physical, psychological and developmental disorders. Currently Cambodia has no specialists in this area of dentistry called "Special Care Dentistry".

Hence we were very happy to accept an offer to help teach our students from two overseas specialists – Associate Professor Dr Mas Suryalis Ahmad from UiTM University in Malaysia, and Dr Olivia Apperley from New Zealand. Dr Olivia has been to Cambodia and taught our students before, and helped us to provide treatment for a group of children with hemophilia when she was here. A/Professor Suryalis has a Doctor of Clinical Dentistry and a PhD in Special Needs Dentistry from the University of Melbourne. She was able to teach our students online, using a similar curriculum to that used at her own university UiTM. Dr Olivia, who works in a major hospital in NZ, has many years of experience, which she is sharing with our year 5 students this semester. Our own Dr Tort Borany who has a Masters in Preventive Dentistry from Korea is also teaching in the course, focusing on geriatric dentistry.

UP is grateful for the cooperation and support it gets from its many overseas partners, as we try to provide our students with the best education possible. We hope to continue to strenthen our links with UiTM, and several of their lecturers have helped us in recent years, and we hope to send groups of our students there again for an exchange program in future years.

2020'S MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS FOR UP FACULTY OF PHARMACY



COVID-19 has rapidly altered the daily routine of Cambodian citizens. One of the major changes for students is the educational transition from physical class learning to remote learning or online learning. 2020 – The Year of COVID – has been a difficult and challenging year across the world and for UP. Many universities too across the world and in Cambodia are facing extreme financial difficulty. Despite this difficulty, Faculty of Pharmacy of University of Puthisastra have been very committed to promoting constant and progressive educational activities.

The following major achievements belong to the Faculty of Pharmacy (FoP) in 2020:

- #1. FoP has run its normal learning and teaching activities through online delivery. 6007.5 hours (73.10%) of class were virtually conducted by using Google meet while 2220 hours (26.88%) were physically run on campus.
- #2. The practical activities in laboratories in 2020 were not suspended. All pharmacy students were able to do their experiments on campus.
- #3. The clerkship and internship activities in 2020 were normally run by maximizing clerkship hours, expanding more clerkship placements, following strictly the health and social measure during the COVID-19 pandemic.

- #4. FoP has purchased lab equipment costing around USD 40, 000. The new arrival of these pieces of equipment will help to upgrade pharmacy laboratories to become practice and research centers which response to national and international curricular.

FoP kept providing Online Soft-Skill Training by Zoom to pharmacy students: It has collaborated with Friends International to design a soft skill training series freely for pharmacy students by using online platform (Zoom). This online training will specify on 7 topics: (1) Personal development-value, strengths, and motivation. (2) Time management. (3) Stress management. (4) Communication. (5) Being part of a team. (6) Money management. (7) CV and interview.
- #8. FoP kept sending pharmacy students to do Volunteer Jobs in Community pharmacies. With the collaboration with Ucare pharmacy chains which has 22 locations, year-3 and year-4 pharmacy students have been sending to practice in clinical setting.
- #9. University and industry Collaboration: FoP has received research grants from PharmaProdcut Manufacturing (PPM) that is the result from University and industry collaboration. This collaboration mainly focuses on the Black Ginger study in Cambodia. The collaboration is a great achievement between PPM and FoP that would benefit both institutions and contribute to the society at the end.
- #10. FoP has supported pharmacy students to create Cambodian Pharmacy Student Alliance (CamPSA) which become the full member of International Pharmaceutical Students' Federation (IPSF).
- #11. UP Pharmacy, an official CPD provider in Cambodia. UP Pharmacy is officially recognized as a CPD provider in Country though MoU with Pharmacist Council of Cambodia (PCC).
- #12. Dr Chea Sin, Dean of Faculty of Pharmacy, had completed two phases of International Deans' Course Southeast Asia, funded by DAAD (Germran Academic Exchange Service), DIES (Dialogue on Innovative Higher Education Strategies) and German Rectors' Conference.
