UP SIGNS MOU WITH GLOBAL CHILD DENTAL FUND AND DISCUSSES OFFERING A COURSE IN SPECIAL CARE DENTISTRY FOR CAMBODIA AND NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES









On the 18th February, Professor Raman Bedi, Chair of the Global Child Dental Fund based in the UK and Professor Ian Findlay, President and Vice-Chancellor of the University of Puthisastra signed an MOU to promote and develop special care dentistry and other programs.

Professor Bedi, who also launched a new booklet (in Khmer) on Special Care Dentistry, was visiting Cambodia to attend the signing ceremony of the "Phnom Penh Declaration on Special Care Dentistry" which highlight the fundamental dental care requirements of patients with special needs.

The signing ceremony at the MOH was presided over by HE Dr Oeurn Borarorth, Secretary of State, Ministry of Health. The ceremony also included other representatives from the Cambodian Ministry of Health, the Global Child Dental Fund, University of Health Sciences, University of Puthisastra, International University, Health Science Institute of Cambodian Royal Armed Forces, Norton University, Cambodian Dental Association, Cambodian Association of Paediatric Dentistry, One-2-One Cambodia (Healthy Kids and Friends of Clefts in Cambodia projects), and Special Olympics Cambodia.

According to the World Health Organization, approximately 15% of the world population have a chronic disease or disability, with many of these individuals unable to access oral health care because dental professionals do not feel confident enough to treat them. Good oral health is an integral part of overall wellbeing and essential for eating, growth, speech, social development, learning capacity and quality of life.

The Declaration calls for the global dental community, in addition to dental schools in Cambodia, the Cambodian Dental Association, the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport, and other stakeholders, to support Cambodian dental schools to build Special Care Dentistry capacity in the country, ensuring that all children with special care needs can obtain appropriate dental care. UP is committed to taking a leading role in these efforts.

The Declaration also promotes education in Special Care Dentistry. A training booklet in Khmer has been developed to educate dental students and dentists to improve their confidence on the dental management of patients with a wide range of health and development issues, including physical, developmental and mental disabilities, as well as medical conditions. In addition, a series of free videos have been developed by the Global Child Dental Fund with lecturers in Special Care Dentistry from all over Asia. This will be freely available for dentists and dental students worldwide to improve their capacity in this area. Professor Callum Durward from UP has participated in this project and gave one of the lectures in the series.

The Global Child Dental Fund calls on the global dental community to support the Cambodian dental schools to build Special Care Dentistry capacity in the country to ensure all children with special care needs can obtain appropriate care from dental providers. The Declaration calls for a commitment from all the dental schools in Cambodia and the Ministry of Health to:

- · Agree to develop a joint curriculum in Special Care Dentistry for all undergraduate dental programmes
- By the end of 2023, all graduating dental students will have undergone the programme
- Develop a series of continuing professional development materials for general dental practitioners and their teams in Special Care Dentistry
- Provide all dental practices with access to this training by the end of 2023
- Develop, by the end of 2023, a network of dentists, across the country, with enhanced training in Special Care Dentistry
- Establish, by the end of 2022, in each dental school, a named lead in Special Care Dentistry Provision, and by the end of 2023, hands-on experience in Special Care Dentistry for dental students

THE FACULTY OF MEDICINE PARTICIPATED IN THE FURTHER CONSULTATIVE WORKSHOP ON THE CORE COMPETENCY FRAMEWORK FOR THE BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN MEDICAL SCIENCES



The Ministry of Health and WHO organized on 25th February a consultative workshop on the core competency framework for the Bachelor's Degree in Medical Sciences. Representatives of public and private Health Sciences Universities and of Hospitals, MD alumni and students, and NGOs participated.

The second draft of the core competency framework was examined.

The draft has 6 domains, 16 statements and 80 indicators. The 6 domains include:

- 1.Patient care
- 2. Family and community health care
- 3. Ethics and professionalism
- 4. Communication and collaboration
- 5. Management and leadership
- 6. Research and education

Additional inputs were given and discussed, including changing some words, erasing overlaps, and adding more indicators. The next step will be the revision of the national undergraduate medical curriculum. The work should be completed by the end of 2022.

Last week two dental students, Tan Bunho (year 4) and Yorm Sileng (year 3), travelled to Siem Reap with several students from UHS and the local representatives of the Hiroshima University / Cambodia school outreach project. This program has been running since 2009 in three schools in Siem Reap, and in the past has involved annual visits by students and staff from the Faculty of Dentistry at Hiroshima University. However due to Covid they have not been able to visit for the last two years. This year the outreach involved only students from the two Cambodian partners - UP and UHS.

Over 3 days, the students provided oral health education to hundreds of school children, who were also provided with free toothbrushes and toothpaste. As UP has an MOU with the Faculty of Dentistry at Hiroshima University we are glad to be supporting this project and look forward to meeting the Dean and his team when they are next able to travel to Cambodia.

Before the formal ceremony ended, both universitiess engaged in a discussion on possible future collaborations and agreements revolving around subject matter and areas of study. As a result, there are three related programs that universities should consider - Medicine, English Language- and Nursing.

UP BUYS NEW DENTAL INSTRUMENTS FOR ITS COMMUNITY WORK







UP dental students in recent weeks have been visiting the Special Education school for deaf and blind children at Chbar Ampov, and providing basic dental treatment on site, in the Healthy Kids program which is under One-2-One Cambodia. The services provided include oral health education, topical fluoride applications, fissure sealants and simple white fillings (without the need for local anesthetic and drills). Children are provided with free toothbrushes and toothpaste, and our UP students have also been monitoring the daily toothbrushing program.

The children and staff have been very helpful and cooperative, which has allowed the dental students to further develop their clinical and communication skills. With year 4 students about to start in the school program, UP has recently invested in some new instruments - called pyramidal scrapers.

Assoc Prof Anand Marya was able to bring back a bag of these instruments following his recent trip to India, which have now been added to our community dentistry set. Thank you Dr Anand! Next week volunteer UP students will start work at the People Improvement Organization (PIO) NGO, which has a school for low income children in Stung Meanchey. We have been working with PIO for several years, and they are fully committed to the Healthy Kids Cambodia project which One-2-One and UP have been promoting in Phnom Penh and other parts of Cambodia. Thanks to UP for investing in this important project.

"DOCTOR - I DON'T LIKE THE COLOUR OF MY TEETH!"



With age teeth tend to become darker - and may no longer be attractive. Tooth whitening (bleaching) is a simple and safe way to make the teeth a whiter shade. The UP Dental Hospital is offering a 10% discount on tooth whitening for the months of March and April. The cost is \$63 (after discount) for whitening of both the upper and lower front teeth.

The procedure involves having impressions of your teeth taken, so that plastic "whitening trays" can be made to fit closely around your teeth. Each day whitening gel is placed in the tray (1 drop per tooth) and you need to wear the trays for at least 2 hours per day. The whitening occurs over several weeks. The trays can be kept and used again if you feel the need to whiten again in the future.

THESIS RAISES IMPORTANT QUESTIONS ABOUT VACCINATIONS AMONG HEALTH SCIENCE STUDENTS IN CAMBODIA



Last week two batch 1 dental students (Peng Thirat and Tan Bora) presented their thesis defense on "Improving Cross Infection Control in the UP Dental Clinic". The thesis was supervised by Dr Hou Sokuntheary from the MOH, and Prof Callum Durward. The defense was chaired by Dr Prom Vireak, Deputy Dean of Medicine, and generated some passionate discussion about the research methods, the issues around cross infection control, and what needs to be done to ensure that it is maintained at a very high standard.

One of the most interesting findings was that many students and staff were unaware of their vaccination history, and many were unaware of their status concerning hepatitis B, hepatitis C and HIV. Dentists are in a higher risk group for contracting these infections (as well as Covid 19) if good cross infection procedures are not followed. Overseas, in most universities, health science students need to have certain vaccinations, as well as blood tests to show their status before they can start working with patients in clinics or hospitals. For example at NYU students need the following: general physical examination report; TB screening; MMR and Varicella titers (and vaccines if needed); Hep B titer (and vaccine if needed); evidence of Tetanus/Diphtheria/Pertussis vaccine; Meningococcal response; Covid vaccine.

In Cambodia there are no such requirements at the present time. Further studies are needed so that we can make recommendations on what might be appropriate for our own medical, dental, pharmacy, lab, midwifery and nursing students – to protect them and their patients from these infectious diseases.

Mr. Reut Davin



THE FACULTY OF MEDICINE HAS ORGANIZED AN ONLINE CONSULTATIVE MEETING WITH PARTNER HOSPITALS REGARDING THE NEW CLERKSHIP AND INTERNSHIP POLICY



On 23rd February 2022, the Faculty of Medicine organized a consultative online meeting with the 14 Hospitals and Training Centers where UP MD Program clerkship and internship rotations take place. The aim of the meeting was to present the new policy of the MD clerkships and internships, which include the responsibilities of the hospitals and of the students/interns. In his opening remarks, the Dean of the Faculty, Prof. Sandro Vento, outlined the great importance of a proper and correct filling of the logbooks, which are supposed to have remarks, notes and comments pertaining to each individual students and to their behavior, medical knowledge and practical skills acquired.

Dr. Prom Vireak, Deputy Dean for Clinical Affairs, illustrated the use and completion of the logbook by the students and the need for comments by the mentors/monitors. Several important points were discussed, including students' attendance, eventual spot checks and organization of the students' rotations within the hospital departments. Dr. Chhim Sarath, Deputy Dean for Research, presented the most important aspects of the MD thesis guidelines and solicited applications from qualified hospital candidates as thesis supervisors. The meeting ended with a fruitful discussion. The Faculty of Medicine trusts that there will be a progressive improvement in the students' experience and in their fundamental hospital learning.

UP PHARMACY STAFF ENGAGE IN RESEARCH ACTIVITIES



The University is very pleased that recently, the first semester of pharmacy students was completed successfully. Taking this opportunity, leaders, full-time teachers and pharmacy staffs have spared some times after teaching and working to conduct study research and develop new research projects. We have basically focus on laboratory and social science research. This research study was initiated by the leadership, full-time teachers and pharmacy staffs. We have recently selected a variety of flowering plants from different regions that exist directly in the Kingdom of Cambodia and some modern medicine from the market.

We have selected a variety of flowering plants from different regions that exist directly in the Kingdom of Cambodia. At the same time, we also study and analyze the quality and quantity of medicines taken from the market with the quality analysis machines available in the Faculty of Pharmacy. In addition, we have added research to the social sciences. All these research activities provide opportunities for all medical students who wish to participate in the study together.

We are very excited and excited about the research activities that the faculty and faculty leaders have given this great opportunity to the full-time students, faculty and pharmacy staff. All of these are the will and vision of the Faculty of Pharmacy, University of Puthisastra.

PHARMACEUTICAL TECHNOLOGY LABORATORY OF UNIVERSITY OF PUTHISASTRA



This laboratory covers in pharmaceutical technology course. It is used for the practical work of year 4 and year 5 students. The objective of practice in the Pharmaceutical Technology lab are:

- To practice producing different forms of pharmaceutical products such as Syrup Suspension, Capsule, Tablet, Suppository, or Balm
- Use some machinery for drug preparation and drug quality control

Moreover, there are some technical machines that are used in pharmaceutical technology laboratories such as Hardness tester, Friability tester, Disintegration tester, and so on. We would like to seek any collaborations with pharmaceutical company, industries, and other educational institutions to develop drug formulations.
