## UP VISIT BY PIERRE FAUCHARD ACADEMY INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT





The Pierre Fauchard Academy (PFA) is one of the world's oldest dental honor organizations and was founded in 1936 by Dr. Elmer S. Best, a Minnesota dentist. Troubled by the proprietary nature of many dental publications, he wanted to help the profession gain control of its literature and assure its independence from commercial interests.

His passionate concern for the search for knowledge and the raising of professional standards laid the groundwork for the beginning of the Academy. This attracted outstanding dental researchers and teachers to its ranks and led to a continuing role in fostering dental science.

The Academy is named after Pierre Fauchard of France (1678-1761), who is recognized as the "Father of Modern Dentistry"; for raising dentistry to a profession. He wrote a book named "Le Chirurgien Dentiste, ou Traité des Dents" - the first true textbook of dentistry.

The mission of the Pierre Fauchard Academy is to recognize and develop outstanding leadership in our profession internationally. They accomplish this by consistently focusing on professionalism, integrity, and ethics worldwide, by their conduct as worthy role models, by the advancement of dentistry to the highest level, by supporting and honoring colleagues for their outstanding work, research, contributions, and public service, and by providing excellence inprograms, education, and leadership in oral health care.

During the recent visit to Cambodia by the PFA International President (Dr Armyl Banez) and the Asia Trustee (Dr Myrna Banez), Assoc Professor Anand Marya (Head of Orthodontics at UP) was officially inducted as the Section Chairman for the Cambodia Section.

The Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry, Professor Callum Durward, has been a Fellow of the Academy for about 15 years and was pleased to welcome our distinguished visitors to UP. After a campus tour, our guests had a question-and- answer session with students and staff from the Faculty of Dentistry. It is hoped that the PFA Cambodian Section can grow in the coming years, and the possible formation of a student chapter was discussed. In Cambodia, PFA hopes to focus on leadership development, dental education, student research, and community service.

## PRE-HOSPITAL TRAINING FOR YEAR 7 MEDICAL STUDENTS



Continuing its pre-hospital training courses, the Faculty of Medicine hasorganized one Course for MD year 7 students about to start their internship. UP is the only university to offer pre-hospital to its students. The one-day training was divided into 3 stations:

#### Station 1: "Seriously III Patients":

Students learnt to assess the signs of patients in serious conditions. The algorithm ABCDE, which stands for Airway, Breathing, Circulation, Disability and Exposure, was applied in the practical training. With each of the conditions, students learnt to take the initial step in their management, such as choosing the appropriate face mask and applying high-flow oxygen, performing intubation and giving boluses in case of shock. The students were also encouraged to apply critical thinking in making a diagnosis in emergency cases.

#### Station 2: "Advanced Cardiac Life Support":

Students learned how to evaluate the cardiac rhythm and to distinguish shockable and non-shockable rhythms. They also learnt to choose the right emergency medications for cardiac life support.

#### Station 3: "Reading Arterial Blood Gas Analysis":

The students learnt the basic rules in interpreting arterial blood gas analysis results. They also learnt to differentiate between the partial and full compensation of arterial blood gases. Case studies were presented and interpreted.


## THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS AT UP

## PHARMACY STUDY TOUR AND RESEARCH



The Faculty of Pharmacy of the University of Puthisastra, under the direction of Dr. Chea Sin, Dean of the Faculty of Pharmacy and a member of the Steering Committee of the Volunteer Youth Movement of the Union of Youth Federations of Cambodia for the Private Higher Education Institutions, led 265 pharmacy students to conduct study tour and research in Siem Reap under the theme: "Collecting voucher specimen, surveys related to the use of medicinal plants and health education" with the participation from plant biology Professor and traditional healers.

During the study tour, there was also the support and attention of the leaders of the University of Puthisastra, the Union of Youth Federations of Cambodia at the University of Puthisastra and the authorities at all levels of Siem Reap to make the whole process smooth. The purpose of this study tour were to:

- Conduct ethnobotanical research:, pharmacy students participated in research activities under the guidance of the pharmacy faculty, which includes Medicinal Plants, Ethanobotanical survey and Community Health Education. Students had been involved in writing research proposals, collecting data, entering data, analyzing data and writing Manuscripts.
- Implement the method of plant collecting and establishing voucher specimen stored at the University of Puthisastra: The plant samples would be studied and stored as a reference with proper packaging under the guidance of the professor and traditional healers.
- Build a solidarity with the staff and students: Teamwork and communication are very important for the safety of medicine use and the quality of care, medical students must know how to work as a team and work with professionals as well as patients. In this project, students had worked to exchange and teamwork with other teams to develop their soft skills.
- Strengthen the quality of health education and charity: The understanding of health education is very important because we can use the knowledge we have learned for our people as well as their families. During the Covid pandemic, people are struggling, so this is a good sharing of the health care of the people there.

A big thank you to the University of Puthisastra, as well as the Union of Youth Federations of Cambodia at Puthisastra for supporting and sponsored companies that have supported this project.



The four invited judges, Dr Chea Sin (Dean of Pharmacy, UP), Dr Mom Kong (Director, Cambodian Movement for Health), Dr. Ray Rany (Director of Tobacco and Health, Ministry of Health) and Miss Choung Chanboramey (President of UP student senate) had previously shortlisted 10 finalists from among the 71 entries from students who came from many different schools and universities around Phnom Penh and provinces.

The top 5 will now go on to compete in the finals in front of a large audience and invited dignitaries from the Ministry of Health and other institutions. The Final will be held on 23 May from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm at Cambodia-Korea Corporation Center. All UP students and staff are invited to attend this event which will be broadcast live through UP and CMH Facebook pages. The prizes for the top 3 winners are 2 million riels, 1.5 million riels and 1.2 million riels, plus a medal and the appreciation certificate issued by UP.

#### UP THESIS LEADS TO CHANGES IN CLINICAL COMPETENCY ASSESSMENTS IN FACULTY OF DENTISTRY







To ensure that students are competent on graduation to perform basic dental procedures, several years ago the Faculty of Dentistry introduced a range of competency assessments for a range of procedures. This is standard practice in dental schools around the world, however this is not the case in all Cambodian dental schools. Each student has a form (with the steps of the procedure listed down) to be signed off by a nominated tutor – who has assessed whether they are competent to perform a particular skill safely and without error. Competency tests are presently used in addition to the normal clinical log sheet which record the number of procedures completed.

Only when a student has already practiced the procedure several times on patients, they can request a competency test be done. The tutor observes the procedure from beginning to end and assesses whether they are competent or not. If they do NOT pass, they can do it again at a later date on a different patient.

Recently a thesis was defended which looked at the introduction of the UP Clinical Competency Assessments in the Faculty of Dentistry. The three students were Ouch Dara, Ly Sovanna and Chhon Thavy. The thesis was supervised by Dr Soy Rasy and co-supervisor Prof Callum Durward. In the study, which was conducted prior to Covid-19, senior dental students as well as their clinical tutors answered a questionnaire about the clinical competency assessments that all students must complete before graduation. Although their views on competencies were overall very positive - many felt that:

- · some competencies were too difficult or too time consuming
- · there were too many competency assessments
- it was sometimes difficult to find tutors who had enough time to assess students doing all their competencies in the clinic.

The thesis passed with credit. Following the thesis defense the faculty decided to reduce the number of competencies to 21 - eliminating some of the more difficult and time-consuming ones. Students are very happy with these changes, and we are still able to ensure that our graduates are competent to practice dentistry safely when they graduate from UP.

Students who select one or more clubs/societies will be emailed at a later date to set up the first meeting where dates, times and locations will be discussed.


