UP UNDERGRADUATE DENTAL STUDENTS AIM TO PLEASE THE PATIENT








An excellent case demonstrating the restoration of occlusal caries was recently carried out by UP year 6 student Heng Liching. He used a special procedure called "the stamp technique" to improve the occlusal anatomy of the restoration. The cavity was restored with composite restoration under rubber dam isolation which is considered as the gold standard in restorative dentistry. Most cases of restorative and endodontic treatment are done under rubber dam in the UP Dental Hospital, which adds to the quality of treatment our students can provide. The restoration turned out to be very aesthetic, and the patient was very happy. The cost was only \$8.

UP WELCOMES CAMBODIA'S FIRST SPECIALIST IN ESTHETIC DENTISTRY



Huy Chandarong Cases Presentation

UP welcomes Dr. Huy Chandarong to join our staff as a part-time lecturer and clinical tutor once he completes his Master Degree in Implant and Esthetic Dentistry at Chulalongkorn University in Thailand. He is the only Cambodian dentist with this specialist degree, and we are delighted to have him join us. As well as being an excellent clinician, Dr Darong enjoys teaching, and so he is an excellent fit for UP.

His Masters degree covered both esthetic and implant dentistry, including treatment of complex cases. For the esthetic restorative part, the focus was on anterior restorations such as veneers, crowns, "Smile design" as well as onlays and inlays. The course also included some parts of operative dentistry such as bonding and composite systems, involving all kinds of direct restorations.

For the implant part, the course covered from basic to advanced implant dentistry. Dr Darong was able to practice on a wide variety of patients (from simple cases to advanced) including sinus lift, GBR, bone block and soft tissue grafts.

We look forward to welcoming Dr Darong to UP to begin his teaching next semester.

UP STUDENTS BENEFIT FROM HAVING INTERNATIONAL LECTURERS













Last semester UP dental students were taught by several lecturers from overseas, mostly from UiTM and University of Malaysia. The lecturers included:

- 1.Assoc Prof Thomas George and Dr Anand Ramanathan University of Malaya. They taught courses for year 4 and year 6 students in oral pathology. They are both specialists in oral pathology. Unfortunately Cambodia has no specialists in this field.
- 2. Professor Massuryalis Ahmad Prof Mas is from UiTM and is a specialist in Special Needs Dentistry. Cambodia has no specialist in this discipline.
- 3. Prof Kack Kyun Kim Seoul National University (retired). Prof Kim has been coming to Cambodia for many years to teach oral microbiology. Part of the course he taught during a visit to Phnom Penh, and the rest he taught on-line. Cambodia has no oral microbiologist.
- 4. Team of 12 dentists from UiTM led by Head of Department Dr Noorhaliana Zohdi and assisted by Dr Sarene Saw Jijia. The team presented a series of lecturers on Practice Management for Year 7 students. Students had to make a business plan for a new clinic. They also visited some of the top dental practices in Cambodia as part of the course.

UP GETS APPROVAL FOR MASTERS IN ORTHODONTICS





As the top-ranked university in Cambodia UP has achieved yet another landmark with the Faculty of Dentistry getting approval from the Ministry of Health for their first ministry-recognized postgraduate program in Dentistry.

UP is very pleased to announce that it has received permission from the Ministry of Health to open a Masters's program in the specialist field of Orthodontics in the near future. This has been planned for several years, and we are very excited to invite applications for the new 3-year program. The Program Director is Assoc. Prof. Dr. Anand Marya, the Head of Orthodontics at UP.

Our aim at UP is again to make this the best program in Orthodontics available in Cambodia, and we shall leave no stone unturned in our efforts to continuously develop this program. The course will be taught by several top orthodontists in Cambodia and some from overseas, including the US, Australia, Malaysia, and South Korea. Most of the training will be carried out here in our UP Dental Hospital; however, there also will be practical sessions at National Pediatric Hospital (to treat cleft lip and palate children) and at Preah Ang Duong Hospital (to treat patients requiring orthodontic treatment prior to orthognathic (jaw) surgery). There will also be opportunities for overseas placements, exchange programs in collaboration with well-known universities, and options to pursue further studies with partner universities. We have already started reaching out to partner universities in other countries to discuss more collaborations in orthodontic research and education to provide our potential residents with the best opportunities.

The Masters in Orthodontics program will help provide a background in the basic sciences underlying orthodontic treatment and instill a critical, independent, problem-solving approach toward clinical orthodontic practice. All Masters' residents will have opportunities to learn contemporary orthodontic treatment techniques and understand the current thinking relevant to patients' diagnosis, treatment planning, and clinical management.

We will be providing updates regarding the admissions process very soon. All applicants will be required to sit an entry exam and take an interview. A high understanding of English and an excellent academic record is required. Only dentists who have graduated at least two years ago can apply. UP hopes this will be the best orthodontics course in Cambodia and of an international standard. Our special thanks to the UP Faculty of Dentistry staff, Ms. Rien Samthyda (Registrar), and President lan Findlay for their support and encouragement.

EIGHT MEDICAL STUDENTS WILL PARTICIPATE IN THE INTERNATIONAL CHALLENGE OF EMERGENCY MEDICINE COMPETITION AT KON KAEN UNIVERSITY, THAILAND







After intensive training, eight year-7 medical students will fly to Thailand to join the ICEM competition, which in 2023 focuses on cardiology emergencies. The students have received both theoretical and simulation skill training since November 2022.

The 5-day competition event will be divided into three rounds. The initial phase will consist of multiple-choice questions, short answer questions and modified essay questions. 8 of the 20 teams from Cambodia, Thailand, Malaysia, Philippines, Indonesia and Japan will then proceed to the semi-finals, consisting of team competition. The four winning teams will proceed to the final round of simulation skills.

During the meeting with Prof. Ian Findlay prior to their departure, the students showed appreciation for his support. In return, the President wished them luck, expecting them to bring back prizes and make UP proud.

CLINICAL MEDICINE 5-DAY WORKSHOP FOR YEAR 7 MEDICAL STUDENTS









A team of specialists in Internal Medicine, Cardiology and Obstetrics & Gynecology from Canada and USA held a 5-day Workshop for year-7 medical students. Professor Ian Findlay, UP President and Vice-Chancellor, opened the event.

The Workshop consisted of lecturers and simulation practice, and focused on congestive heart failure, ECG, arrythmias, urinary bleeding, eclampsia, among other topics.

The students had to pass a final exam to get a certificate at the end of the Workshop. Students and Faculty are grateful to the specialists who were involved in the Workshop.

RABIES PRESENTATION TO UP STAFF







Dr. Prom Vireak, Deputy Dean for Clinical Affairs of the Faculty of Medicine, recently gave a presentation about rabies to UP staff.

Here is a summary of the presentation:

- 1. What is rabies? Rabies is a fatal but preventable disease. It is caused by the rabid virus, that affects the central nervous system, especially the brain, causing encephalitis.
- 2. How can the disease spread? The rabid virus resides in the salivary gland of mammals such as pets. The virus can be transmitted through bites or scratches of the rabid animal.
- 3. What animals are common reservoirs? In many countries, animal reservoirs are dogs, cats, bats, racoons, skunks and foxes. In Cambodia, which is a rabies endemic country, the dog is the most common disease transmitter. A study done in 1998-2007 by the Institute Pasteur du Cambodge found that 95.5% of the cases are due to dogs.
- 4. What are the symptoms of rabies? There are 3 stages:
 - a) Prodrome syndrome (2-3 days): paresthesia and itching over the healed bite wound scar, fever, insomnia, muscles pain, restlessness and palpitation.
 - b) Stage of excitement: the patient develops hyperesthesia and hydrophobia (is afraid of water)
 - c)Late stage: there are aerophobia (is afraid of air), delusion, hallucination, fly biting and spitting. Once the clinical signs of rabies appear, the patient is going to die, usually within one week.
- 5. What is the treatment of rabies? Once symptoms of rabies develop, the treatment is palliative care only. However, before the symptoms, the anti-rabies prophylaxis can be initiated with either rabies vaccines or/and rabies immunoglobulins for both pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) or post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP).
- 6. What is the pre-exposure prophylaxis? The rabies vaccine is given before the incident, and it is highly recommended for animal handlers and laboratory workers dealing with rabies virus. PrEP requires 3 doses of rabies vaccine: day 0, day 1, and 21 days later.
- 7.What is the post-exposure prophylaxis? Before initiating the anti-rabies treatment, the bite needs to be classified (from less concerning to very concerning incident), and then it can be decided whether to give no rabies vaccine or to give rabies vaccine or vaccine plus rabies immunoglobulins. In any case, a doctor must be consulted. The rabies vaccine can be given via intramuscular injection (5 doses at Day 0, Day 3, Day 7, Day 14 and Day 28) or intradermic injection (2 sites at the same time, Day 0, Day 3 and Day 7).
- 8. How can the wound by bite or scratch of a suspected rabid animal be treated? After exposure to the animal, the wound area should be cleaned with soap and flushed with water for 15 minutes or with 70% alcohol. Deep and large wounds should not be sutured.

The UYFC Team of the University of Puthisastra organized the Beyond the Games campaign to promote the 32nd SEA Games and the 12th ASEAN Para Games, which the Kingdom of Cambodia will host. For the first time in history.

Leaders, staff, team members and students of the University of Puthisastra organized a heart-shaped paper folding event under the theme "Heart of UP beating in one rhythm" to break the world record of 1 million heart-shaped paper by There was also the participation of staff and students.

AUTOMATED TISSUE PROCESSOR FOR BBL PROGRAM







Currently, the Laboratory Sciences Department of Faculty of Health Sciences and Biotechnology of University of Puthisastra has installation of material and equipment of Automated Tissue Processor for Cytopathology.

Automated tissue processors are of two main types: tissue-transfer machines and fluid-transfer machines. The tissue processor finds applications in histopathology laboratories to automatically prepare tissue samples for laboratory testing, by fixing, dehydrating, clearing, and infiltrating them with paraffin.

The Cytopathology is a core of required by multiple components of cancer control. A definitive diagnosis of cancer must be made by a pathological examination of suspicious tissue or fluids. Therefore, the Laboratory Sciences Department has well equipped for the Cytopathology course for students study in BBL Program.

UP has an MOU with Hiroshima University. Last week the Dean and several staff from the University called in to meet colleagues from the Faculty of Dentistry at UP. Professor Kotaro Tanimoto and his team are in Cambodia to take part in their annual community field work project in Siem Reap - for the first time since Covid. The Dean expressed his appreciation for the UP students who volunteered in the project, and hoped that reciprocal visits between UP and Hiroshima can continue. Professor Callum raised the possibility of sending one or two students to Hiroshima to join their 4 year international undergraduate program. Prof Tanimoto said they would consider it. Professor Tanimoto said they were keen to send several of their students to UP on an exchange program in the near future.

Three UP dental students from year 5, Tan Bunho, Vann Sokmean and San Sokna, joined the Hiroshima team in Siem Reap for the school outreach program. During the week they provided oral health education and fluoride applications to the children, as well as helping to prepare the children to see the dentist through story telling and fun activities during the break times. The students enjoyed getting to know the Japanese team, who were mainly staff from Hiroshima University. Students from other Cambodian dental schools also participated. The local Cambodian students also took the Japanese team to the temples and to try Cambodian food.
