

UP COLLABORATES WITH MAJOR AUSTRALIAN UNIVERSITY TO BECOME A GLOBAL UNIVERSITY

On 9th May 2023, UP's President and Vice-Chancellor Professor Ian Findlay signed a historic MOU agreement with Professor Scott Sheppard, Deputy Vice-Chancellor and Vice-President (International and External Relations) of Queensland University of Technology (QUT), Brisbane, Australia.

The agreement anticipates, for the very first time, the opportunity for Cambodian students to study for an Australian degree within Cambodia. This opens up exciting opportunities for many more Cambodians to gain valuable international qualifications at a fraction of the price of studying overseas.

Australian university education is world-class and acclaimed everywhere.

Cambodia recognizes Australian quality as Australia is the top destination for Cambodian students worldwide with over 3000 students going to Australia every year – and now they have a pathway to top-quality Australian degrees within Cambodia.

This agreement also expects to open up opportunities for Cambodians to study over 100 postgraduate Masters degree pathways in both health including Masters of Nursing, Psychology, Clinical Sciences, as well as non-health Masters such as project management, Masters of IT, Computer science, etc. QUT is a Top 10 Australian university and is one of Australia's largest Universities with over 52,000 students and offers academic programs in fields spanning business, creative industries, education, engineering, health, law, science, and social justice across five faculties. QUT is consistently ranked among the top universities in Australia and the world.

Professor Sheppard from QUT said "QUT is proud to partner with UP, Cambodia's leading university, to provide access to top quality Australian degrees that will make a real difference and open up the World for Cambodian graduates".

This MOU is a further step in UP's journey in becoming a top-quality international university - leading Cambodia proudly into achieving Cambodia's middle-income potential and its scientific and economic ambitions. Already UP is the only Cambodian university to have joined the World Elite in the prestigious international THE (Timer Higher Education Ranking), and UP also recently achieved Top 28th private university in the entire ASEAN region.

USING OF CHATGPT IN HIGHER EDUCATION





ChatGPT has become a household name as a go-to tool for users seeking support in a wide range of complex tasks. From handling complex issues, coding programs, syntax, and translation to designing course syllabuses, solving math problems, summarizing texts, conducting literature reviews, writing abstracts, research policies, project proposals, designing creative content, digital marketing, and analyzing case studies, ChatGPT offers assistance in many areas.

However, the rapid development of ChatGPT, from ChatGPT-1 to the most recent version, ChatGPT-4, has raised concerns among many universities worldwide. The overreliance on ChatGPT has led some students to neglect their full learning potential and use ChatGPT to cheat and use ChatGPT to do their assignments. Although some Asian nations, including Cambodia, have not officially permitted the use of ChatGPT, some students in those countries still find ways to use it without authorisation.

In response to this, CamTech University organized an open discussion on "ChatGPT for Higher Education: To Ban, Or Not To Ban, That Is The Question" on April 27, 2023. Esteemed experts from four different higher education institutions, including Prof. CHHEM K. Rethy (Professor of Technology and Humanity at CamTech), Dr. SAM Seth Serey (Director General, Institute of Digital Research and Innovation, CADT), Mr. TAM Sakirin (Vice Dean of Faculty of ICT at University of Puthisastra), and Mr. Leo Fernandez (Vice President for Academic Affairs, KIT), shared their perspectives on the benefits, challenges, control, and overall view of whether to permit or prohibit the use of ChatGPT in higher education institutes.

After a comprehensive five-hour presentation by local and international researchers, the panel discussion arrived at the consensus that ChatGPT-4 has become a significant and spontaneous assistant for all users and should be permitted within the established policy framework.

STC COLLABORATES WITH ROTARY INTERNATIONAL AND THE UNIVERSITY OF PUTHISASTRA!





SPEECH THERAPY CAMBODIA

This year, STC and University of Puthisastra will launch a new dysphagia certificate course in collaboration with Rotary International Foundation.

This university course ensures the sustainability of the work of STC in Cambodia.

The course will have internationally licensed speech pathologists with at least five years of experience in treating swallowing disorders supervising the participants. Fourteen doctors, nurses, and physiotherapists from Phnom Penh hospitals and clinics have enrolled in the course so far. The participants' employers have pledged to support them during their one-year training and to provide ongoing and sustainable dysphagia services for their patients. Two public hospitals and three top-rated private institutions are participating in the program.

One participant expressed the need for a university course:

"For a dysphagia service, I think it is very new in Cambodia. I used to hear about it before, but we never get to know or practice it."

"So it is a great opportunity for our clinicians to learn a new skill that you have provided to strengthen our clinicians. You have added another skill to the healthcare system. This means that we can improve the healthcare system in Cambodia as well."

MD STUDENTS SUCCESSFULLY DEFENDED THEIR THESIS







On 10 May 2023, Mr. BUNNA Sothearith, Mr. DY Bora and Mrs. DARA Malen successfully defended their thesis entitled "Clinical Manifestations and Management of Newborns with Glucose-6-Phosphate Dehydrogenase Deficiency Hospitalized in The Neonatal Unit at the National Pediatric Hospital in 2019". The students passed with credit.

The thesis was supervised by Dr. KIM Bunna and Dr. PEN Kakada. The Thesis Examination Committee, chaired by Dr. CHEA Sin, included Dr. KEA Sokleng, Dr. PHAN Samnang, and Dr. SVAY Somana.

G6PD deficiency is an X-linked hereditary condition. In Cambodia the prevalence ranges from 13.4% to 26.1% in males and from 3.1 to 4.3% in females.

The study found that the frequency of G6PDd was 24.7% and the M:F ratio was 1.25:1. Anemia caused 79.6% and fever 42.4% of admissions.





FROM DATA TO ACTION




During April, Dentistrys CIPO team spent time supporting a number of strategic initiatives. The most important of which was to participate in the Ministry of Health lead "Technical Working Group" meeting. The CIPO team shared their experiences in delivery of oral health care to children and in that way they helped to inform the development of the National Action Plan for Oral Health. The other way that they are supporting that initiative is through developing explainer videos and social media content to gather further engagement. We hope these advocacy actions contribute to increased access to care for children in Cambodia

In terms of clinical care, 400 children received treatment and in addition CIPO supported the prison dental project and student research. There are a number of different groups of dental students who are collecting data in order to evaluate our approach to providing care for children with special needs.

THE FACULTY OF MEDICINE COOPERATES WITH KIDSCAREEVERYWHERE

Dr. Prom Vireak, Deputy Dean for Clinical Affairs, and Dr. Yi Vannary, Assistant Dean for Education, have held an online meeting with Dr. Ronald Dieckmann, Executive Director, and Kerry MacCulloch, Program Director of KidsCareEveryWhere.

During the meeting, Dr. Dieckmann discussed how to possibly allow medical, nursing and pharmacy students to access DynaMed for free by providing institutional access to the University of Puthisastra. DynaMed is a leading clinical



decision support solution with a mission to provide the most useful evidence-based information to healthcare professionals at the point of care to improve health outcomes worldwide. A team will visit UP and provide training on DynaMed use to the students in July. The training could be then extended to part-time lecturers, who are also hospital clinicians. 13 medical students are expected to be DynaMed champions.

MEDICINE AND PHARMACY STUDENTS JOIN PROJECT LOKUN



11 students, who are also the planning committee for Lokun Project in Cambodia, from the Faculty of Medicine and the Faculty of Pharmacy of the University of Puthisastra, together with medical students from the National University of Singapore, went for a humanitarian mission in Pursat Province to provide free-of-charge medical consultations and treatment to people from four villages. The mission lasted 10 days.

This mission has provided the UP students with an opportunity to improve their organizational, management and communication skills in addition to their clinical skills.
