UK AMBASSADOR AND UK TRADE ENVOY CONGRATULATE UP



On the 19th of February, UP was honoured by a delegation visit from HE Dominic Williams, UK Ambassador Cambodia and Mrs Heather Wheeler MP, UK Special Trade Envoy and colleagues.

Both HE Mr Williams and Mrs Wheeler MP are very interested in developing strong links between Cambodia and the UK especially in the higher education area and were delighted to learn more from Professor Ian Findlay, UPs President and Vice-Chancellor about UPs high quality education and partnerships with UK organisations - Teeside University and International Foundation Group (IFG).

Normally Cambodian students wanting to study in the UK must undertake an expensive (~\$50,000) pathway course in the UK, but UP's partnership with IFG allows Cambodian students to take this pathway course whilst staying in Cambodia. Students then obtain a guaranteed direct entry place at more than 22 universities including top quality UK universities. Students study at UP from March 2024 and can start in the UK from September 2024 – no need to delay.

UP's partnership with Teeside university, a top quality university and previous winner of University of the Year in the Times Higher Education Awards; allows UP to explore joint degree programs and student and staff exchanges. Allowing Cambodian students to share their very rich culture with their UK counterparts.

HE Mr Williams and Mrs Wheeler MP also congratulated UP on its success in becoming the only Cambodian university in the prestigious Times Higher Education (THE) Ranking – recognizing UP and Cambodia with the World's Top 1400 universities. They were also delighted to hear about UP's success in becoming a Finalist (Top 8) in THE Asia Leadership Award – beating more than 600 other Asian universities and complimented UP on raising Cambodian education to a world arena.

Professor Findlay showed the UK delegation around UP's world class health facilities including the largest pharmacy in Cambodia and Cambodia's largest dental training hospital. Mrs Wheeler commented that in many ways UP's Health centre was better than those in the UK! Praise indeed!

Later we were honoured at lunch by UP's Chancellor HE Sok Puthivuth. HE Sok Puthivuth and Mrs Wheeler MP had a very fruitful conversation about joint UK and Cambodian education and trade opportunities and both expressed hope that the already excellent relationship between Cambodia and the UK would only grow.

This was Mrs Wheeler's 2nd visit to Cambodia in 6 months demonstrating the UK's commitment to Cambodia and she is looking forward to return later in the year.

UP DENTAL HOSPITAL IS SITE OF SPECIAL NEEDS PATIENT TREATMENT







Special Needs Dental Patients (SNDP) are a greatly underserved portion of the population here in Cambodia. Dr Magnus, a faculty advisor who concentrates in the treatment of SNDP here and in the USA reports that this is also a great problem there and worldwide.

SNDP are often difficult or impossible to treat in the traditional dental setting due to lack of cooperation or complicated medical conditions. For this reason, treatment is often performed under General Anesthesia in the operating room of a hospital. Many less complicated cases can be treated successfully in dental clinics with special skills and often with the aid of Intravenous (IV) Sedation. Unfortunately, this opportunity is not widely available to most patients.

Recently, a dental patient with Special Needs was seen in our clinic at UP Dental Hospital 1 with the aid of IV Sedation under the expert care of Anesthesiologist Dr. In Sovutheara, Dr Magnus, with Im Puthisa and Sreng Ratana assisting.

The patient was carefully chosen for this procedure to ensure safety, and Dr Magnus feels that many more SNDP can be successfully treated in our clinics when properly selected. This will give the handicapped citizens of Cambodia greater access to care and give UP dental students opportunities to learn these valuable skills while raising everyone's awareness regarding these challenges.

UP was one of several dental schools that signed a pledge in 2022 to serve SNDP. UP has been doing this for several years in the hospital setting and will now be the first school to honor this pledge to serve them here in our clinic!

RESEARCH IN COMMUNITY OUTREACH IN MONDULKIRI PROVINCE









132 year-5 pharmacy students under the supervision from the dean and lecturers, have implemented their clinical and research skill in Sen Monorum town, Mondulkiri province from February 05 to 08, 2024.

Starting from the designing the checklists and education message on diabetes, hypertension, medication use review and medicine storage, students have received consecutive trainings on using and evaluating the checklists until students had skillfully implemented these clinical skills.

At the same time, students were required to conduct the research starting writing proposal, ethic committee request, data collection, data entry, data cleaning, data analysis, data interpretation and presentation preparation.

By the end, students had completed their research with presentations and abstracts.



On Tuesday, February 6, 2024, the staff as well as the coordinator of the Community Outreach and Ethnobotanical Survey in Mondulkiri Province from February 5 to 8, 2024, led the students from the second year, the 12th generation, the third year, the 11th generation, the 4th year, and the 10th generation to collect plant voucher specimens at Busra waterfall, Pichda district, Mondulkiri province.

Also involved in the collection of plant voucher specimens were Professor Cheng Son Kang, traditional medicine teacher Kibohang, and teacher Oum Satya. The project has about 534 participants, including doctors, masters, pharmacists, professors of herbal medicine, traditional medicine teachers, drivers, and 510 medical students.

- 3. Pharmacy professionals must do further research and develop the professional capacity.
- 4. Pharmacy professionals must participate in continuing professional development.

UP JOINS "HEALTH AND WELLBEING BREAKFAST"





COMMONNESS OF ILLNESS USE WITH MEDICINAL HERB AMONG PEOPLE IN MONDULKIRI PROVINCE











For many years, indigenous plants have been utilized in Cambodia to enhance health outcomes and treatments. Plant-based medications are frequently employed to treat a range of medical conditions. Base on the information and limitation research on traditional plants, we have came up with ethnobotanical study in Mondulkiri province from February 5–9, 2024, with the aim of identifying common illnesses that the people of Krong Sen Monorom primarily treat with traditional herbs. Preliminary findings indicate that common illnesses like the flu, cold, stomachache, dizziness, hypertension, arthritis, and postpartum symptoms are the most common ailments among others. Nonetheless, several traditional plants whose origins are unknown are still used by the population without seeking from traditional healers. Additionally, we discovered that the use of traditional plants for medicinal purposes remains beneficial for Cambodians living in urban areas.

VISITING KV HOSPITAL











February 5, 2024, a professor of plant biology, traditional healers, alumni, lecturers, staff, and 2nd- through 5th-year pharmacy students from the Faculty of Pharmacy visited KV Hospital, led by Professor Chea Sin, the Dean of the Faculty of Pharmacy. During the visit, students had the chance to learn about the KV hospital's work flow and management system, and they also received some good experience which was shared by the KV hospital's staff, doctors, and pharmacists.

SCIENCE RESEARCH PROGRAM ORGANIZED A SEMINAR ENTITLED "GENERAL TECHNIQUE FOR PLANT TISSUE CULTURE"

Another crucial aspect is the tracking of student progress over time, enabling lecturers to identify areas of improvement and assess the effectiveness of teaching methods.

We believe that the UP-Assessment Standard serves as a comprehensive framework to guide both part-time and full-time teaching staff in creating meaningful assessments that will, in turn, result in enhancing students' academic performance.

The primary objective of this collaborative effort was to enhance their proficiency in administering fluoride varnish treatments to children within their respective communities, thereby elevating the quality of oral healthcare services provided.

PROVIDE ORAL HEALTH EDUCATION TO THE CHILDREN AT TOUL KORK PRIMARY SCHOOL

In February, the Collaborating Centre for Innovation in Population Oral Health (CIPO) at the University of Puthisastra provided Oral Health Education to the children at Toul Kork Primary School.

Eight UP dental students from years 3 and 4 were involved in these activities for two days, conducting instructions inside the classroom and practicing group brushing with support from UP dental students and the CIPO Team. We provided Essential Health Package sets for 737 children, with these packages supported by Ivoclar Company.







MOBILE DENTAL CLUB OUTREACH TO SIEM REAP

MDC (Mobile dental club) is a UP student-organized project that provides oral health education, dental check ups and some preventive dental treatments to underserved communities. The project focuses on rural areas and children. After the dental check up, SDF(silver diamond fluoride) and fissures sealants are applied to the teeth to arrest decay in the primary teeth and prevent dental caries in the permanent molars.

The Project provides a many benefits for the participating dental students. It helps them connect with poor communities, provides valuable clinical experiences, and develops students' hard and soft skills.

Recently MDC traveled to Siem Reap with the goal of teaching dental hygiene and applying SDF to 90 children located at the REACH NGO. Missions will be conducted two or three times a year. The next mission will be on 2-4 March 2024.

In addition to the activities described above, we will give the children education about hand hygiene, oral hygiene, and healthy eating, with a slide presentation, and play some games. MDC is a great chance for dental students to get to know each other and to learn about the local way of life, which includes visiting ancestor temples, dining locally, taking in the scenery, and other activities.



UP DENTAL STUDENTS HELPING THE HOMELESS IN PHNOM PENH

Rotaract Club of Phnom Penh Central, which has many UP Dental Students, has many activities targeting people who need help. Since COVID-19 the club has been helping poor people who are homeless in the Phnom Penh area. These people don't have enough food for themselves and their families. The name of the project is called Food Bank. The project mainly provides the homeless with donated or bought food and water. Sometimes we can provide cooked food. DR. MAGNUS PARTICIPATES IN ANNUAL MEDICAL-DENTAL MISSION PROJECT IN CANDON CITY, PHILIPPINES

Dr. Magnus from UPs, Faculty of Dentistry had an opportunity to serve dental patients in the Philippines in an annual mission sponsored by the Philippine Medical Mission Foundation of Michigan (PAMMFM). The mission took place from February 5-9, 2024. PAMMFM has been sponsoring medical-dental missions for over 20 years.

Dr Magnus participated with a group of nearly 50 other professionals from several regions in the United States and the Philippines. Teaming with three other dentists, they saw 574 patients and removed 1750 teeth over the 5 days mission. The medical team performed 1365 examinations, 106 minor surgeries, and 56 major surgeries.

This was Dr Magnus's fourth trip with PAMMFM. After spending several months in Cambodia this past year, he notes what Cambodia is doing with prevention, and feels that he was able to share many good ideas with his dentist colleagues in the Philippines. He states, "UP and the CIPO Team should be very proud to know that they are providing cutting edge, state-of-the-art preventive dental services to our Cambodian citizens"!

MORE UP DENTAL GRADUATES DEFEND THESIS



On 15 of February the Faculty of Dentistry hosted 2 thesis defenses for batch 4 group 53 and batch 3 group 47.

B4G53 students named SEAT Moniroth, HONG Konitha and HEN Sopheakta defended their thesis entitled "Occupational Health Problems among Cambodia Dentists" under the supervision of Dr. HORN Rithvitou. The thesis chair of examiners was Prof. Rodrigo Jose MARINO supported by examiners Dr. KONG Kalyan and Dr. KONG Sophannary. The result was a PASS WITH CREDIT. Congratulations. This is the first time that an investigation into occupational health problems in Cambodian dentists has been investigated, and several areas of concern were identified.

Below is the abstract for the thesis:

Background: Dental practitioners face many occupational related health problems despite numerous technical advances in recent decades. The dental profession is one of the most hazardous professions compared to other health related professions. Cambodian dentists do suffer from a range of physiological and psychological health problems and many dentists have been affected by various illnesses.

Aim: This study was conducted to investigate the occupational health problems related to dental practice among Cambodian dentists along with exploring the range and prevalence of health problems among Cambodian dentists with the associated risk factors.

Methods: A hundred and six convenience sampling from 4 locations in Cambodia was recruited and face-to-face interviewed.

The questionnaire included demographics, belief in health problems, their personal health problems, relevant factors and perception for preventing the problems.

Result: Musculoskeletal problems such as back pain, shoulder pain, pain on the arm, pain on the feet, eye problems, hearing problems and skin problem are common health problems identified among Cambodian dentists. Approximately half of males and two-thirds of female's dentists rated their current health status as fair. 84.9% of the participants beliefs that wrong posture during practicing is the cause of health problems. All dentists have experienced physical problems such as wrist pain, back pain, and neck pain. 20.7% have experienced stress.

Conclusion: Cambodian dentists face a variety of occupational health problems the most common being musculoskeletal problem such as backpain, shoulder pain, arm/hand pain, as well as stress and eyes problems. To minimize the risk of work-related musculoskeletal disorders (WMSDs) among dentists, work postures need to be improved.

The second thesis defended recently was group B3G47 which included TAING Muhok, OEUNG Lyheng, and UN Pechpiseth on the topic of "Dental Anxiety among Students at the University of Puthisastra". This research was conducted under the supervision of Dr. SAM Sovatdy and co-supervisor of KONG Sophannary. The thesis chair of examiners was Prof. Rodrigo Jose MARINO and examiners were Dr. KONG Kalyan and Dr. SOM Sochenda. The result was PASS WITH CREDIT. Congratulations to the students. The study found that many students did have anxiety related to dental treatment, often because of previous dental experiences.

The Abstract is presented below:

Background: A thoughtful and appropriate questionnaires of the Modified Dental Anxiety Scale (MDAS) is necessary to manage dental anxiety. The reliability and validity of the MDAS is yet to demonstrate among Cambodian population. The present study aims to show the level of MDAS among University of Puthisastra (UP) 's students.

Methods: This was a cross-sectional online survey on UP students from different majors at all level using a Google form. Email invitations were sent to all student's university email addresses. Responses from dental students were excluded. Data was extracted from Google Forms as a CSF file. MS Excel was used to clean up the data, and quantitative analysis was performed using statistical program SPSS.

Results: The questionnaire was sent to UP Students. There were 195 eligible UP students who participated in the survey. Among them, 138 (70.8%) were female and 57 (29.2%) were male. There was no difference in mean MDAS score between gender. The total MDAS score was 12.27 (±1.05). Moreover, 10.3% of the students showed high dental anxiety scores (MDAS >19) with a mean score of 20.45(±1.84). There was no correlation between the MDAS and general anxiety level of the participants. Individual past dental experiences was accounted for 25% of the total responses which presented with higher MDAS score (MDAS >19) which were statistically significant presenting with severe dental anxiety (p-value <0.05).

Conclusions: Dental anxiety among university students was relatively correlated with previous dental experiences, specifically on those who had pain and dental extraction. It is noticed that more female students express more dental anxiety than male students. The MDAS scale is a reliable tool to determine each patient's dental anxiety level prior to a dental treatment. It could be useful for local dentists to evaluate the patient's dental anxiety in their own practices specifically in patients who have had negative dental experiences from their previous dental treatment. Moreover, psychological and pharmaceutical interventions are key to diminish dental anxiety.

On 20th of February the Faculty of Dentistry hosted a thesis defense for batch 4 group 49. Students were HAN Sopheara, LIM Monyrorth and SOVANN Rithy under the supervision of Dr. HORN Rithvitou. The chair of examiners was Asst. Prof. SOEUN Sopharith and examiners were Dr. TORT Borany, Dr. CHHE Phearom and Dr. YOS Chantho. The result was PASS with Credit. Congratulations.

Abstract

Background – In permanent dentition, majority of caries lesions occur is in the First Permanent Molars (FPM). Due to the high rate of caries on the occlusal surfaces of the FPMs a range of procedures such as pit and fissure sealant, Silver Diamine Fluoride (SDF) application, and Fluoride varnish, have been proposed and tested in order to prevent caries development on FPM. In this study the effectiveness for preventing caries lesions on the occlusal surfaces of the FPMs by biannually apply SDF and GIC pit and fissure sealants is compared.

Aim – to compare the incidence of caries on the occlusal surfaces of first permanent molars (FPM) after 1 year among children who were treated with SDF biannually compared to children who were treated with GIC pit and fissure sealants.

Methodology – a secondary analysis of three datasets was carried out to examine the incidence of cavitated caries lesions on occlusal surfaces of First Permanent Molars (FPM). Two datasets were derived from the SEAL Cambodia project which had two research cohorts. The first cohort involved placement of Fuji VII fissure sealants using a standard protocol (SEAL group). The second cohort involved placement of the same material, but with a modified protocol and with better control measures in place (mSEAL group). The third dataset involved children who brushed their teeth at school with a fluoride toothpaste and who were to be treated with Silver Diamine Fluoride (SDF) in a clinical trial (SDF/Tooth Brushing (TB) group). Details on method and collection of data have been previously published.

Result – Data from 3317 FPM were included and 2217 (66.8%) followed. Risk ratios for carious lesion development suggest some uncertainty around the benefits among the SEAL Group (RR = 0.81; CI 0.66, 1.05) whereas the mSEAL group had the greatest benefit (RR = 0.17; CI 0.12, 0.32) followed by the 38% SDF/TB group (RR = 0.54; CI 0.40, 0.80) Conclusion–The mSEAL group had the most favorable outcome in preventing carious lesion development. In addition, biannual application of 38% SDF and TB was able to halve the incidence of caries on FPM.
