

UP RANKED 6TH TOP PRIVATE UNIVERSITY ON EMPLOYABILITY AMONG ASEAN UNIVERSITIES





The University of Puthisastra (UP) is in 6th position for Employability from 80 ASEAN universities according to AppliedHE Public and Private University Ranking 2024. Employability is arguably the most important ranking because it shows how successful UP students are at getting good jobs – a primary function of a university.

According to most recent data, more than 96% of UP graduates rapidly get a job and new graduates earn an average salary of \$521 per month - 80% more than the average (\$290 per month) in Phnom Penh or 63% more than new teachers (\$320). 
UP was also rated 34th on research (UP published more than 200 papers in 2022) and 13th ranking overall.

Faculty members explored how this approach could be applied in medical education to promote active learning and improve student outcomes.

In the second session, participants learned strategies for developing Higher-Level Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs) for assessment purposes. Dr. Vannary guided them through the process of crafting MCQs that go beyond simple recall and assess higher-order thinking skills (critical analysis and problem-solving). The session emphasized the importance of aligning assessment methods with desired learning outcomes and provided practical tips for creating effective assessment tools.

By the end of the training, participants gained a deeper understanding of innovative teaching methodologies and assessment strategies specifically tailored to medical education.


