

LESSONS FROM ASIA:

THE RAPIDLY CHANGING LANDSCAPE OF HIGHER EDUCATION

May 2024 saw Asia's brightest and best universities gather in Kuala Lumpur to discuss the future of higher education.

The Times Higher Education (THE) Asia Universities Summit 2024 gathered 793 of Asia's top universities (Including University of Puthisastra (UP) as Cambodia's only entrant) to discuss "Bridging Frontiers: Changing the Landscape of Education in Asia".

The conference brought the expertise of Asia's best universities to share knowledge, skills, and future visions and was an incredible opportunity to reinforce the value of higher education driving economic success. High quality graduates drive high quality investment and capacity building towards a knowledge economy which drives economic success even more.

It is not a coincidence that the most economically successful countries such as US, UK, Germany, and China, Singapore and Korea in Asia all invest very heavily in education.

The three day conference very strongly encouraged universities to rethink and innovate. The brains of Asia highlighted the importance of:

- TNE international experience and partnerships giving students a global outlook to compete internationally, "to be
 the best, we need to learn from the best"
- · Invest for success every dollar invested in higher education returns almost \$10 in economic benefit
- Universities and education are changing very rapidly so need to be a Disruptor, modernizer and changer. Need to break resistance to change. Need to adapt or die

The main takeaway was that the world is changing very rapidly, so we must also change very rapidly just to keep up.

"He who rejects change is the architect of decay. The only thing that rejects progress is the cemetery." Harold Wilson

Reflecting on the points highlighted above, UP is very much aware of rapid changes in society which not impacts curriculum, teaching and learning and student assessment but also the soft skills students require to be flexible and adaptable in this rapidly changing world.

To ensure success, UP embeds four main skills into EVERY single course at UP:

- English UP provides 4 years of intensive English free of charge. Reflecting that English is the language of international success
- IT skills including AI so that students not only exist in our Digital 4.0 world but can master technology
- Research skills not just evaluate information and create new knowledge but also critically understand the world around us
- Critical thinking/soft skills including CV writing, interview skills, team work, persuasion, leadership. A degree will get
 the first job but its soft-skills that will get the promotion

UP offers students experiential learning, critical thinking, and English to ensure that students maximise their learning experience. UP's flexible learning enables students to become self-directed life-long learners embracing the power of digital literacy.

UP has more 230 MOUs, including 73 with international universities, enabling many international collaboration and partnerships. UP plans for every UP student to have an international experience.

UP's international partnerships allow UP students guaranteed access to world class universities in the UK and Australia including guaranteed access to Western medical schools.

With these rapid changes, UP upskills both support staff and teaching staff with over 74 continuous professional development (CPD) courses annually to ensure UP responds to social change.

UP EARNED TOP 8 RANKING FROM 76,000 ASIAN UNIVERSITIES





The University of Puthisastra was ranked in the top 8 among the 793 elite Asia Universities from 6065 ranked universities and 76,000 other universities (including all other Cambodian universities) not even ranked for Leadership and Management Team of the Year 2024.

This ranking demonstrated that UP plays a very important and essential role in improving the quality of education, human capacity and socio-economic development in Cambodia.

DR. MARVIN JEFFREY JANSEN VISITED UP'S FACULTY OF MEDICINE



Dr. Marvin Jeffrey Jansen, PhD, Director of the Clinical Skills Center at the Faculty of Health Sciences of the University of Cape Town in South Africa and Director of the African Simulation Network, visited for five days the Faculty of Medicine at the invitation of the Dean, Professor Sandro Vento.

Dr. Jansen works in the best medical school in Africa and one of the best medical schools worldwide, where the integration of basic science, clinical medicine and both basic and translational research is given the importance it deserves, and clinical skills training sessions involving medical students, nursing students, physiotherapy students and other health science students happen regularly and are fully integrated in the curriculum.

During his stay, Dr. Jansen observed the simulation training provided to medical students at UP, and delivered a lecture entitled "The Role of Medical Simulation in Developing Acute Care Clinical Competence in Undergraduate Medical Students". He highlighted the great importance of simulation in modern medical education and the fact that in a simulation environment the students can make mistakes and learn, with proper and constant feedback, from their mistakes to minimize harm when dealing with real patients in a clinical environment.

During his visit, Dr. Jansen provided valuable feedback and advised on how to improve clinical skills training at UP.



FOCUS ON IT



Over the last 5 years UP's the Faculty of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) has made substantial improvements. Overall, the Faculty of ICT is committed and well-resourced to deliver high-quality education that meets and exceeds the demands of the digital era.

Through a combination of rigorous curriculum, experiential learning opportunities, and strategic partnerships, we ensure that our graduates are well-equipped to excel in their careers and make meaningful contributions to the ever-evolving field of information technology.

Despite these many successes and UP's IT degrees being top quality programs, UP is known as a "health university" rather than IT university. This naturally limits awareness and limits enrolments – this is being addressed by extensive Marketing Campaigns.

UP Exceeds Cambodia's Requirements

UP programs focus on both programming and computer network majors. Both curricula offer superior competencies including emerging skills such as AI and data science, positioning our graduates for success in the evolving digital landscape.

According to the study of "Cambodia Digital Skill Roadmaps 2024-2035" published by Ministry of Post and Telecommunication, the current Cambodian University Standard is 14% of programming courses and 12% of computer network courses delivered by most of the universities in Cambodia. • Current Cambodian University Standard for programming is 13%. UP delivers 43% in programming major and 39% in our networking major.

- Current Cambodian University Standard for networking is 11%. UP delivers 13% in programming major and 39% in our networking major.
- Current Cambodian University Standard requirement for AI is 0%. UP delivers 13% in programming major and 11% in our networking major.

UP's high-quality programs SUBSTANTIALLY EXCEEDS Cambodia's Current Cambodian University Standard in all stated requirements.

Student Outcomes

- UP graduates have superior competency and are in very high demand in the industry. As result 100% ICT students in year 3 and 4 are fully employed.
- Average salary of graduates = \$521 above market rates.

International Recognition

UP has strengthened its collaborations with international universities and industries.

UP's IT programs have been internationally recognized as International Quality by Australian (Queensland University of Technology and Griffith University) and British Universities (Teesside and Leeds Universities). Leeds university is Top Russell Group University and a TOP 100 university in the World (QS Rankings).

International Partnerships

UP has partnerships with INTI International University-Malaysia, Kyondong University-Korea, Binance Academy, and Oxygen Media group.

By leveraging global partnerships, students gain exposure to diverse perspectives, cutting-edge technologies, and best practices from around the world. These collaborations also facilitate research initiatives, credit recognition, improve university ranking, and enabling faculty members to contribute to international journals and advance the field of ICT.

International Publications

In 2023, ICT have published 4 articles in Q1 and other international journals. IT Academic staff are frequent speakers on ITV and write IT articles in top newspaper such as Khmer Times, and Education Technology Insights APAC.

- 32% of IT teaching staff have doctorate degrees
- 68% of IT teaching staff have Masters degrees

Far exceeding Cambodia's average - 8% with doctorate degrees

Workshops And Professional Development

UP's IT have conducted several workshops and seminars for ICT students including; Cyber Security in Cambodia 2023, Leadership in ICT, Understand Cybercrime, and ERP system using Odoo.

We also conduct CPD programs to upskill UP staff and launched several short courses in each semester for the public to gain wider knowledge about IT.

CAMBODIA SMILE PROGRAM



The Cambodia Smile program is a National Action Plan for Oral Health led by public health officials at health centers, including dental nurses, nurses, and midwives. The program aims to provide oral health education and apply fluoride varnish every 3 months to young children during their vaccination visits.

It operates in three provinces: Siem Reap (11 health centers), Kampong Chnang (6 health centers), and Kampong Speu (18 health centers). This initiative is supported by the Collaborating Centre for Innovation in Population Oral Health (CIPO) of Puthisastra.

Up to now, the program has successfully provided fluoride varnish applications to 1,020 children.







UP hosts successful webinars with Prof. Paul Abbott on Dental Trauma Management


The Department of Dentistry is hosting a series of webinars on dental and maxillofacial trauma.


