#### FUN RUN - RAISING FUN TO SUPPORT KIDS WITH AUTISM











## CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING COURSE FOR CAMBODIAN PHARMACISTS

All participants will receive 5 points after completing the course.

The objectives of this CPD training course are to provide pharmacists with knowledge on the following topics:

- 1. To have knowledge, skills, and good management attitudes.
- 2. To become a good manager to successfully lead an organization according to strategic plans.

This training course is essential for government organizations, non-governmental organizations, and private companies to enhance the safety and well-being of the community as a priority.

#### DR. MAGNUS VISITS HOSPITALS IN TAIWAN AND THAILAND



Dr. Magnus, UP's Department of Dentistry, recently visited Hospital Dentistry programs at National Cheng Kung University Hospital in Tainan City, Taiwan, and at Thammasat University in Bangkok, Thailand.

The goal of these visits was to collect detailed information about how SNDP were managed and treated in these organizations. Dr. Magnus states that the purpose of this effort is to improve and standardize UP's treatment methods and protocols in the treatment of SNDP in its local clinics and area hospitals.

His activities included attending General Anesthesia dental procedures, observing the hospital's outpatient clinics that have been adapted specifically for the treatment of Special Needs Dental Patients (SNDP), and home dental visits to the homebound. He also attended and observed lectures and training of future SN Dentists. Dr. Magnus observed that in the two countries, there is strong integration between dentistry and medicine in training and in providing patient care in their dental colleges. This is quite different from what he observes in many countries in the world, including the USA. Finally, Dr Magnus was invited to present a lecture about SNDP care under IV Sedation and General Anesthesia to fellow attendees at Thammasat University.

Dr. Magnus intends to visit other Universities in the months to come. Back home, UP will be able to start treating more SNDP soon, providing improved health for our patients and continued learning opportunities for UP Dental students.

#### FACULTY OF MEDICINE VISITING TECHO SANTEPHEAP NATIONAL HOSPITAL





#### FIP-UNESCO UNITWIN CFE IN WPR DISCUSSION



Asst. Prof. Chhea Sophearom attended the meeting discussed the FIP-UNESCO UNITWIN CfE agenda in the Western Pacific Region (WPR), focusing on patient safety work packages, the development of Patient Information Documents (PIDs), and the Philippine Pharmacy Education Roadmap.

Key points included the need for baseline data on the pharmacy patient safety curriculum, as well as the identification of barriers and enablers to its implementation. A budget was allocated for open-access publication.

The Philippine roadmap aims to produce globally competent pharmacists by 2030 and is outlined in a 300-page document accessible to all Filipinos. It includes 10 action plans, emphasizing faculty development, strategic partnerships, and global recognition.

The team also discussed the need for translation services and budget allocation for translation and logistics.

#### MEDICAL STUDENT PARTICIPATING IN THE SMILE CAMBODIA MISSION



Mr. Nov Mengfong, a year-4 medical student took part in the Smile Cambodia Mission held at Siem Reap Provincial Referral Hospital from 12th to 16th march 2025. Over the course of this impactful five-day mission, he served as an Operating Room Assistant, contributing to 44 life-changing surgeries for children with cleft lips and cleft palates.

Led by the head surgeon and supported by the China Council of Lions Club a top surgeon from Shanghai, the team worked tirelessly to ensure each child received the best possible care. Thanks to their efforts, all surgical procedures were carried out successfully, bringing new hope and beautiful smiles to dozens of young faces.

The mission prioritized children with congenital birth defects and other plastic surgery needs, aiming to enhance their quality of life. In total, approximately 60 patients received consultations, with 44 undergoing surgeries. The remaining patients have been scheduled for the next mission, set to take place in June in Kampot Province, where they will receive priority treatment.

### FACULTY OF MEDICINE JOINING HYGIENE PROJECT LAUNCH BY SOMA INITIATIVE IN TAKEO PROVINCE

### EMPOWERING NEW EDUCATORS: CBME WORKSHOP STRENGTHENS TEACHING FOUNDATIONS IN FACUTLY OF MEDICINE



On April 8, 2025, the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Puthisastra successfully hosted a focused workshop titled "Foundations of Teaching in CBME: A Workshop for New Lecturers" at Room L41. With 12 part-time faculties in attendance, the session aimed to build a solid understanding of Competency-Based Medical Education (CBME) and equip participants with essential teaching strategies aligned with CBME principles.

The workshop began with an opening speech by Asst. Prof. Dr. Prom Vireak, Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, who emphasized the importance of transitioning from traditional teaching models to competency-driven approaches that prioritize learner outcomes and readiness for clinical practice.

The first core session, led by Asst. Prof. Dr. YI Vannary, introduced participants to the foundational principles and current trends in CBME. This was followed by a practical overview of assessment in CBME—crucial for ensuring that teaching aligns with desired competencies.

Asst. Prof. Prom Vireak then facilitated an interactive session on constructing high-order thinking multiple-choice questions (MCQs) for CBME-aligned assessments. This hands-on segment offered lecturers a chance to refine their skills in designing assessment tools that support both formative and summative evaluations.

The final session, also led by Dr. Yl Vannary, explored the use of active learning strategies in CBME—highlighting Case-Based Learning (CBL) as a powerful method to promote clinical reasoning and student engagement.

Participants appreciated the opportunity to connect theory with practical application, setting a strong foundation for their teaching careers at UP. The Faculty of Medicine continues to lead the way in modernizing medical education through targeted professional development initiatives like this workshop.

#### CASE PRESENTATION BY YEAR 3 BACHELOR OF MIDWIFERY STUDENTS



The clerkship is a vital component of midwifery education. It offers hands-on training that allows students to transition from theory to practice. During this period, students work closely with experienced healthcare providers, engage directly with patients, and apply their academic knowledge in clinical settings. This invaluable experience plays a crucial role in strengthening clinical competencies, enhancing patient care skills, and preparing students for the realities and responsibilities of midwifery practice.

As part of this learning journey, on April 8, 2025, Year 3 Bachelor of Midwifery students held a case presentation session in Hall B after successfully completing their clinical clerkship at Cambodia–China Friendship Preah Kossamak Hospital and Samdech Euv–Samdech Mae Referral Hospital.

The students were organized into four groups, each consisting of four to five members. They presented a variety of case studies on topics including diabetes, acute pharyngitis, syphilis, and herpes simplex. The presentations were delivered in an engaging and informative manner, reflecting the students' ability to connect theoretical knowledge with practical clinical experience.




