

UP FACULTY OF MEDICINE HOLDS WHITE COAT CEREMONY FOR YEAR-4 MEDICAL STUDENTS



On 09 December 2025, the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Puthisastra (UP) held one of its most meaningful academic traditions, the White Coat Ceremony, honoring Year 4 medical students as they officially enter their clinical training in hospitals.

The event marked a profound transition: from pre-clinical learning in classrooms and laboratories to real-life patient care in clinical settings. In his keynote remarks, Professor Ian Rouse, President and Vice-Chancellor of the University of Puthisastra described the day as “one of the most moving moments in university life,” reminding students that the white coat is far more than a uniform. It is a promise to serve life, protect dignity, and uphold humanity at the center of medical practice.

President Ian emphasized that as students step into hospital wards, they step into a legacy larger than themselves, a legacy of healing in a country that deeply understands resilience and recovery. He also encouraged students to remember their purpose during moments of difficulty or self-doubt: “Your hands will learn procedures. Your mind will master science.

But your character, your integrity, humility, and courage will be what truly defines you.” Assistant Professor Prom Vireak, Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, provided historical context behind the symbolism of the white coat. He explained that while doctors once wore black coats for formality, the shift to white in the late 19th century followed the rise of germ theory and the recognition of hygiene as essential to preventing infection. The white coat came to

represent purity, cleanliness, and scientific integrity, values that remain central in modern medical practice.


Speaking to the students, he highlighted five core meanings of the white coat: professional responsibility, compassionate care, authority rooted in expertise, strict hygiene, and a lifelong commitment to science. Medicine, he reminded them, is both a privilege and a profound responsibility toward human life.

The ceremony, celebrated annually at UP for over seven years, is a powerful rite of passage that prepares students emotionally and professionally for life inside the hospital. It marks the beginning of a journey where theoretical knowledge meets real patients, real families, and real human stories.

As the students donned their white coats, the message was clear: they are no longer just learners; they are future healers and future leaders of Cambodia's healthcare system.

The University of Puthisastra congratulated all Year 4 medical students and wished them courage, wisdom, and compassion as they begin their clinical training.


This opportunity provides early, hands-on exposure to academic research, allowing the students to support both MD thesis projects and faculty-led studies.

4TH-YEAR UP PHARMACY STUDENTS BEGIN MEDICAL LABORATORY INTERNSHIPS ACROSS HOSPITAL IN PHNOM PENH



On Monday morning, December 8, 2025, 18 groups of fourth-year Bachelor of Pharmacy students from the University of Puthisastra officially commenced medical laboratory internships across multiple hospitals in Phnom Penh.

MEDICAL STUDENTS SUCCESSFULLY DEFENDED THE THESIS IN NOVEMBER

On 27th November 2025, Faculty of Medicine proudly announced the successful thesis defense of an MD thesis titled “A Cross-Sectional Study of Foot Care: Knowledge, Attitude, and Practices of Diabetic Patients in Preah Ang Duong Hospital.” Led by Chair Asst. Prof. Dr. Prom Vireak, with examiners Dr. Aun Hemrin and Dr. Nov Tam, and supervision by Dr. Chin Chan David, the research team—RA Pachaka, Rachna Rathphiya, and Kheam Leakhena—delivered an excellent presentation demonstrating both academic rigor and strong commitment to improving diabetic care in Cambodia.



Their work highlights an important public health priority, addressing the widespread yet preventable complication of diabetic foot disease.

The study assessed knowledge, attitudes, and practices (KAP) among 300 diabetic patients at Preah Ang Duong Hospital and uncovered a significant gap between foot care awareness and actual practice.

Although many patients showed positive attitudes and moderate practice levels, overall knowledge remained low—emphasizing the urgent need for improved patient education and counseling. The findings underscore the importance of strengthening health literacy and targeted health education strategies to reduce preventable disability.

UP extends heartfelt congratulations to the thesis team and their supervisors for contributing valuable insights that can help enhance diabetes management across Cambodia.

FACULTY OF MEDICINE CONDUCTED THE ORIENTATION FOR MD YEAR 2 AND 3
